I am a third year law student at The University of Toledo College of Law, and I am determined to pursue a career as an assistant prosecuting attorney upon graduation in May, 2016. I will be taking the Ohio Bar Exam in July 2016. My academic and professional training, combined with my passion for criminal justice, make me a strong candidate for a position as an assistant prosecutor.

I already possess extensive and varied criminal law experience. Before law school, I was employed as a law clerk for two summers and during holidays by the Lawrence County Prosecutor's Office in Ironton, Ohio. That experience peaked my interest in the study of law. I was inspired by interacting with clients and assisting attorneys in and out of the courtroom.

Through my work in the Criminal Appeals Clinic, I have refined my research and writing skills. During my training as a member of the Trial Advocacy Team, I developed strong oral advocacy skills which are critical in the courtroom.
