According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, opioid overdose deaths were five times higher in 2016 than in 1999. In 2017, the Acting Health and Human Services (HHS) Secretary issued a statement upon declaring a nationwide public health emergency regarding the opioid crisis. All jurisdictions are struggling with the opioid crisis and recognize the need to attack it from every front.
