1:15 - 2:15 Forensic Assessment of Malingering and Deception in Children and Adolescents

Clinicians providing psychological assessments to the juvenile court increasingly must confront issues of symptom validity or effort in evaluations of youth before the court. Yet, there is little research and even fewer measures concerning the assessment of malingering or deception in children and adolescents. Assessment of malingering or feigning, as is the case with forensic assessments in general, must be developmentally appropriate and requires specialized knowledge and training. This workshop will review current research, conceptual models, and assessment methodologies. Case illustrations will be presented including the use of the MMPI-A-RF as well as other relevant instruments.
